Retired NBA star Alonzo Mourning's home in Coral Gables, FL is listed at 14.5 million dollars.

Located in a gated community called Coral Gable Estates, the home, built in 2004, is on $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre of waterfront on the bay, on a cul-de-sac. The 13,000-square-foot house overlooks the water and has eight bedrooms and $8\frac{1}{2}$ bathrooms. There's also a library, a gym and a four-car garage. Outside there's a kitchen and dining area and an infinity pool.

Mr. Mourning's NBA career lasted 15 years, most of which he played with the Heat. He retired in 2009 and is currently focusing on charitable work.

Mr. and Mrs. Mourning, who bought the home in 2005, are selling because they're looking to downsize, says William Meyersohn of Coldwell Banker Previews International, who shares the listing with Michael Williams, also of Coldwell Banker.

Designer Donald J. Pliner Puts Home on the Market

Designer Donald J. Pliner has listed his Miami Beach home for \$19.9 million.

On just under an acre, the Moroccan-style home has four bedrooms, $8\frac{1}{2}$ bathrooms and maid's quarters. There is a saltwater pool, a gazebo and extensive gardens. The property has an outdoor kitchen as well as

100 feet of waterfront with docking for boats. Inside, there are 30-foot ceilings, marble floors and several hand-painted murals. The home is on Star Island, which has been home to such celebrities as Shaquille O'Neal, Gloria Estefan and Rosie O'Donnell.

Lourdes Alatraste of Engel & Volkers and Sylvia Fragos of Great Estate International Realty have the listing. Ms. Alatraste says Mr. Pliner is selling because he's looking to relocate to Los Angeles for business.

La Jolla Beachfront Estate Returns to the Market

The La Jolla, Calif., estate of the late scientist Roger Revelle's family has come back on the market for \$12.5 million. It originally listed last year for \$14 million, then was taken off the home several months ago for remodeling.

Dr. Revelle, who died in 1991, was among the earliest to study global warming and one of the founders of the University of California, San Diego. The property has been in the Revelle family since 1920; the house was built in 1922. It has 115 feet of beachfront and a 4,100-square-foot, five-bedroom, five-bathroom house, as well as a guest house. There's also a fish pond and a swimming pool.

Dr. Revelle's widow died in 2009. The home is owned by their four grown children. Linda Marrone of Coldwell Banker Previews in La Jolla has the listing.
